Hidden away deep in the suburban San Fernando Valley, legendary cult musician Swamp Dogg, alongside housemates Moogstar and Guitar Shorty, has transformed his home into an artistic playground. Together, they navigate the tumultuous waves of the music industry, and forge a wonderfully bizarre and inspiring path across time and space.

The musical force known as Swamp Dogg (AKA Jerry Williams Jr.), has spent the past 65 years in the music industry as a singer, songwriter, A&R man, performer, and record producer. Once described as "one of the great cult figures of 20th century American music," and "the soul genius time forgot," Williams is a genuine eccentric responsible for some of the most unique rock-influenced R&B (and wildest album covers) ever made.

Returning for another year, we're happy to have FOREIGNERZ capture the essence of the festival on film! You'll probably see their cameras out and about at various venues. FOREIGNERZ is a local full service art and production house focused on pushing the boundary in film, music, art, and culture. 



Cherry Glazerr's brazen snarl is never far from a dreamy refrain. Their stomping garage rock and hazy pop dirges have propelled the group to tear up the Coachella stage and write music for Yves Saint Laurent. This eclectic journey is fitting for a band so adventurous.

Clementine Creevy created Cherry Glazerr in 2013 at the age of 15. She committed her early tracks as a solo artist to tape with *Papa Cremp*, a lo-fi romp of grilled cheese worship and teen drama.

Debut album Haxel Princess saw Cherry Glazerr evolve into a ramshackle fuzz-rock trio anchored by Creevy's cheeky delivery of droll aphorisms. Apocalipstick, their first record with Secretly Canadian, solidified the band as a polished riff engine brimming with fierce social commentary. This growth continued on Stuffed & Ready, plumbing the depths of new wave groove to bring Creevy's increasingly vulnerable lyrics to the surface.

Creevy has also contributed vocals to songs by Tyler, the Creator and Death Grips, and spent a season guest-starring



on the TV show *Transparent* from 2014 to 2015.

2023's I Don't Want You Anymore is Cherry Glazerr's most ambitious album yet. Brawny punk riffing drives tracks like "Ready For You." Songs like "Bad Habit," meanwhile, forgo guitars for spiralling vocal loops and danceable production that burrows into the mind. It was ranked one of the best rock albums of 2023 by *PopMatters* and is the perfect primer for Cherry Glazerr's return to Calgary after their sold-out show at Sled Island 2018.







It is a community band playing deeply improvised, rhythm music full of love and social commitment. IE came together spontaneously, organically, in April of 2015 at "Musicians Against Police Brutality," a day of protest sound and discussion in Brooklyn. All were artists and activists of varying degrees: Philadelphia-based Ayewa and Neuringer, and D.C.-based Stewart as veterans of the Mid-Atlantic noisehardcore-experimental scene, while Holmes and Navarro as recent New England Conservatory grads Each of the studio albums that followed – 2020's Who Sent You? and 2021's Open The Gates – developed this legend further.

In 2023, IE signed to the fabled Impulse! Records, and released its most accomplished work to date, *Protect Your Light*, on September 8, 2023, primarily recorded at New Jersey's historic Van Gelder Studios. It features eight examples of how IE's collaborative composition strategies and Ayewa's in-communion verses result in some of the most potent music being made in the third decade of the 21st century, music with communal light and love at its heart. Get to that love on time — don't force history to guide you.

Her vocals are tactile and intimate, whether or not you speak Spanish. Molina's music feels beamed directly into your ears, just for you. Her command of synthetic and acoustic textures in tandem are warm, fresh, playful and entirely her own. That might be why *Rolling Stone* compared her to both Brian Wilson of The Beach Boys and Kevin Shields of My Bloody Valentine. They, like Molina, are two artists who created entire genres by resisting the confines of their day. Her nine studio releases chart the course of an unpredictable visionary, from four Domino discs from the '90s to 2019 EP *ForFun* and her first-ever live record, *ANRMAL - Live in Mexico*, released in 2020.

She has also lent her vocals to past Sled Island guest curator Deerhoof, as well as German impresarios The Notwist, two artists with whom she has nothing in common but tremendous vision. Sometimes, if you have enough talent and singularity, things just make sense.


# LAUREL HALO LOS ANGELES, CA Fri 8:00pm - Central United Church

Prolific electronic music producer Laurel Halo described her newest album *Atlas* as "the feeling of everywhere becoming nowhere" to NPR. That intangible feeling is conveyed across layers of jazzy instrumentation that weave in and out of songs like the piano-driven "Naked to the Light."

Atlas's change in sound is typical of Halo's genre-agnostic approach, but this sort of rumination is a common thread throughout all of her work. Her debut album Quarantine—named the best release of 2012 by The Wire—built a foundation of luscious synth-pop for sparse yet vulnerable lyrics. Follow-up album Chance of Rain and 2015 double-EP In Situ, meanwhile, harnessed instrumental abstraction to create ominous collages of sound.

Halo's third album with taste-making electronic label Hyperdub was *Dust*, and featured collaborators like Sled Island alum Julia Holter. In 2018, Halo further swerved in sound, drawing inspiration from scoring the Dutch documentary *Possessed* to produce a six-track mini-album of ambient sonic textures called *Raw Silk Uncut Wood*.

Released in 2023 on her own label Awe, *Atlas* captures Halo's multi-faceted approach to audio art. The echoes of techno rhythm on "Late Night Drive" blend seamlessly into the orchestral arrangements of "Sick Eros," evoking fleeting images and scenery as if viewed from a car window. Also since last year, Halo is now a faculty member of Composition and Experimental Sound Practices at The California Institute of the Arts.





### MALCOLM MOONEY & THE ELEVENTH PLANET

Artist and musician Malcolm Mooney's career is as daring as his wildly experimental music. For more than five decades, he has left an indelible mark on outré art with his multi-genre exploration and creative output.


Originally from New York, Mooney's career has taken him across the globe and back. He was credited as a "linguistic space communicator" on Monster Movie, the 1969 debut album from legendary German krautrock band Can. The 20-minute album closer, "You Doo Right," features Mooney chanting excerpts from a love letter while the band shreds, showcasing his unique style of intimate spoken-word performance.

In the biographical book All Gates Open: The Story of Can, founding member Holger Czukay says, "Can wasn't sure which way to go musically until Malcolm Mooney jumped up to the microphone one day and pushed us into A RHYTHM." Mooney also lent his wailed incantations to the final Can album *Rite Time* in 1986.

Outside of his work with Can, Mooney has recorded three albums with the San Francisco band The Tenth Planet and collaborated with artists such as Andy Votel of Twisted Nerve Records and percussion composer Sean Noonan. Now based in Calgary, he is an instructor of abstract painting at the Alberta University of the Arts, and his visual art showcases around the world.

His new project, The Eleventh Planet, has finished recording a debut album, and the impressive new lineup features Sonic Youth's Steve Shelley (drums), Ava Mendoza of Unnatural Ways (guitar), Daniel Morano (percussion), Devin Brahja Waldman (sax), Peter Conhiem (bass/electronics), and Alexis Marcelo (piano/keyboard) with the crucial voice of Malcolm Mooney front and centre. Though it's just the latest sonic adventure for Mooney, it looks to be both a monument to a staggering career and a glimpse at a vibrant future.





### MICK JENKINS CHICAGO, IL Fri 10:00pm - Palace Theatre

Before releasing his breakout mixtape *Trees & Truths* in 2013, peerless rapper Mick Jenkins worked in fashion, poetry and the justice system. Raised on neo-soul and contemporary Black gospel, Jenkins has steadily built his one-of-one place in hip-hop — and music in general — over the course of increasingly excellent releases.

Last year's album *The Patience* (an *Exclaim!* Staff pick for 2023) might be his crown jewel. Anchored by slick, live instrumentalism and an eclectic approach to drum programming, the record seamlessly flows through laid-back vibes that let Jenkins create his best verses to date. Peppered with culinary wordplay and symbiotic guest verses from Freddie Gibbs, J.I.D and Vic Mensa, it's a lush and lean work where most tracks are shorter than two-and-half minutes.

Speaking of Vic Mensa, both he and fellow Chicagoan Chance the Rapper have been supporters of Jenkins since his earliest days. The three combined their distinct identities on the standout single "Crossroads" back in 2013. A few other non-Patience tracks to start out with are "Jazz" (from The Water(s) mixtape and which has 80+ million streams on Spotify), "Carefree" (from 2020 album The Circus) and two tracks featuring serpentwithfeet ("Scottie Pippen" and "Rug" from 2021 record Elephant in the Room).

Get a teaser of the elegant power Jenkins brings to the stage by watching his Tiny Desk (Home) Concert for NPR, shot back in 2021. Remember, this is just a preview – Jenkins is an artist who refuses to not keep getting better, and we're sure to see that for ourselves when he makes his Sled Island debut, performing with a full band at The Palace Theatre.



Punk incinerators Show Me the Body made their major arrival with first album Body War in 2016, drawing on the elemental shape of hardcore to lash out at injustice. Then and since, the trio (currently made up of Julian Cashwan Pratt, Harlan Steed and Jack McDermott) has been a disruptor of the genre's conventions. Shredding on banjo rather than guitar, vocalist Pratt slips occasionally from howls into rap and poetry, and elements of noise, sludge and electronic music frequently interject the trio's punk core.

It's not just in their music that Show Me the Body fights for space to exist and create. Partly inspired by their time spent with youth-run artist collective Letter Racer, Show Me the Body formed their own alliance, CORPUS, to unite artists in a community and connect with DIY scenes outside the five boroughs. The resulting mixtape, Corpus I (2017), saw them collaborate with acts like Princess Nokia, Moor Mother, Denzel Curry and Dedekind Cut.

CORPUS has since grown into CORPUS Family, a more fulsome representation of

Show Me the Body and their associates' values. "It's supposed to be something that galvanizes people to work on their own communities," Steed told *The FADER*. They have worked to increase inclusion in music communities, reclaim space, build solidarity and even advocate self-defense. Their direct-action initiatives have included a coat drive for the people of Queens, coalition support for the Black Alliance for Just Immigration, the CORPUS Family Mutual Aid Fund and more.

Second album Dog Whistle took punk on a whiplash ride between minimalist metal, invocation-ritual industrial and experimentations that don't quite have a name yet. But if you're looking for a starting point, there are three excellent options all released in the last year: LP Trouble The Water (Pitchfork said the band "strike gold" with "daring" music in a glowing review), a remix album (perfect to get a sense for their genreagnostic experimentalism) and Live & Loose In The USA (a primer for the glorious chaos they bring to the stage).

While the band was supposed to make its Calgary debut at Sled Island 2020 (selected by Sudan Archives), now is an even-more vital time to encounter Show Me the Body, given their prolific-and-rewarding hot streak.

It's an album willing to break the past to envision a new future, with the scorching track "Guilty Of Being... Wait" updating an old Minor Threat anthem. Another untitled album came a year later, introducing avant-garde breakdowns and pointed lyrics that declare, "Comfort is a fallacy afforded by complacency." The band's next release in 2019 interrupted the punk rushes with hip-hop verses and jazzy chords, blazing a path for Soul Glo to sign with Epitaph Records in 2021 and tour with Sheer Mag and My Chemical Romance.

Major label debut *Diaspora Problems* grabbed the world by the collar and



gave a fierce shake. Across 12 blistering tracks, Soul Glo careens from breathless shredding on "John J" to tripped-out sampling on "Driponomics," a speaker-breaking banger with guest verses by Mother Maryrose. Rolling Stone named it the best metal album of 2022.

Latest Soul Glo single "If I Speak (Shut The Fuck Up)" rides a droning bass line into an intoxicating wall of noise as vocalist Jordan yells a mission statement: "If I speak, I'm coming through elbows first." Make way for those elbows when Soul Glo tears up Sled Island this June.





1970s psychedelic rock pioneers W.I.T.C.H. were the forerunners of a subgenre of African music known as Zamrock. Taking inspiration from artists like Black Sabbath and Blue Cheer, they forged a sound all their own through personal innovations like funky basslines and screaming organ melodies, with lyrics that often recalled the light-hearted fun of '50s surf rock.

Zamrock was a new type of psychedelic rock that married American blues guitar styles with British heavy metal pacing and German prog complexity. According to Zambian music lecturer Lunga Sianagowa, Zambia did not have many recording studios throughout the '50s and '60s. The difficult process and production of Zamrock, which had to be recorded and produced in Kenya,

helped to create its distinctive lo-fi sound.

W.I.T.C.H. led a musical revolution with Zamrock that was as fierce as it was short-lived. A mixture of political censorship and the AIDS epidemic, which took the lives of some of W.I.T.C.H.'s original members, forced Zamrock into the underground. Most of the movement's biggest bands had disbanded by the 1990s.

A newfound appreciation of psychedelic rock and lo-fi recording in the late 2010s brought W.I.T.C.H. to a global audience that had yet to see its importance during its heyday.

W.I.T.C.H. has reformed, with original member Emanyeo "Jagari" Chanda joined by a new lineup to revive the spirit of Zamrock. As they say in the closing track of their 2023 album Zango, the band has been reborn "like the story of the Phoenix, the bird from the ashes."




### **RECYCLING AND WASTE REDUCTION**

# SAFER SPACES

Everyone has the right to feel safe at Sled Island regardless of age, ancestry, colour, family status, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, mental disability, physical disability, place of origin, race, religious beliefs, sexual orientation or source of income (Alberta Human Rights Act).

The policy will be updated on an ongoing basis to ensure it meets the needs of our community. If you have questions or comments, please get in touch with us at contact@sledisland.com.

### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

Sled Island is committed to creating venues and experiences that are free of abusive and discriminatory behaviours that pose a direct threat to the physical or psychological safety of attendees and participants. We strive to create an environment where everyone is treated with respect and care, and can enjoy their time at Sled Island while being their true selves.

Creating Safer Spaces requires collective commitment, participation, and accountability, and we ask all participants and attendees to treat others with kindness, and to notify us of any behaviour that violates this Code of Conduct at Sled Island events

### The following will not be tolerated at any Sled Island event:

- Discrimination
- Harassment
- Sexual abuse or misconduct of any kind
- Physical assault or any form of violence
- Bullying
- Wearing offensive or culturally insensitive attire (ex: displaying hate symbols such as swastika or thin blue line symbols, or wearing a culturally significant outfit from a culture that is not yours)

### As a Sled Island participant or attendee, we ask you to:

- Respect the right of other attendees and participants to enjoy their experience;
- Respect others' physical and emotional boundaries;
- Respect people's chosen pronouns, regardless of their gender expression (when in doubt, you can discreetly ask the person or use gender-neutral pronouns);
- Be mindful of how your own privileges and behaviours impact the experience of others (take care of each other)



### **COMMUNITY BYSTANDER TRAINING**

All Sled Island staff and venue managers undergo mandatory annual Community Bystander Training provided by the Centre for Sexuality and are equipped to provide interventions that center the person(s) experiencing the abusive or discriminatory behaviours, but please do not hesitate to reach out to any Sled Island volunteer, security, or venue staff if you require immediate assistance.

All Sled Island venues are actively encouraged to undergo this same training with their staff and are made aware of this policy and agree to abide by it during the festival.

### **HOW TO ACCESS SUPPORT**

If you witness a violation of the Sled Island Code of Conduct at any festival event, please speak with a volunteer venue manager (ask any Sled Island volunteer for assistance finding the venue manager). Notifying the Sled Island venue manager ensures that senior management is notified and that the incident can be followed up on.

If you require urgent medical attention or psychological support, the Sled Island venue manager or any Sled Island staff can connect you with available resources specialized in crisis response, such as:

### **SAFE ROOMS & SAFE WALKS**

Whenever possible, Sled Island venues will offer safe room access upon request. To access a safe room, please speak with a Sled Island volunteer venue manager (ask any Sled Island volunteer for assistance finding the volunteer venue manager). Safe walks to a second festival location or support while waiting for public or other transportation are also available upon request.

### **HARM REDUCTION**

Sled Island does not condone the use of illegal substances, but we believe that harm reduction is a vital component of any community's opioid overdose prevention approach.

This year, we're happy to partner with Street Cats YYC who will have an information booth and distribute free harm reduction supplies, including Naloxone Kits, at the following shows: Sled Island Kick-Off show at Commonwealth on June 18, Soul Glo show at Dickens on June 20, Moments Fest Showcase at the Ship & Anchor on June 21 and Show Me the Body at the Legion on June 22.

### **NEIGHBOURHOOD OVERVIEW**

Not familiar with Calgary? Our discount guide also doubles as a great tour guide! Community partners are categorized by type and color coded by neighbourhood to make them easy to find. We've also included venues in our neighbourhood descriptions so you can know exactly where to grab a coffee on your way to the Central Library, or where to catch up with your pals for a couple of cocktails on the way to the next show.

- 17th Avenue: 17th Avenue SW is a vibrant hub that is home to some of Calgary's best boutiques restaurants, and bars; the most populated area running from 14 St SW to Centre St S. Venues on 17th Avenue include Pin-Bar, Sloth Records and The Ship & Anchor.
- Beltline: North of 17th Avenue and west of Victoria Park, Calgary's Beltline runs North to South from 10 Ave Sw to 17 Ave SW, and East to West from 1 St SW to 14 St SW. Venues in the Beltline include The BLOX Arts Centre, Modern Love and Commonwealth.
- Downtown Core: The Downtown Core (also known as "The Core") is where most of Calgary's office towers are located, as well as the central C-Train lines. The Downtown Core runs North to South from 1 Ave Sw to 9 Ave SW and East to West from 7 St SE to 14 St SW and also encompasses the East Village and Eau Claire areas. Venues in the Downtown Core include The #1 Legion, Central United Church, Dickens, The Palace, The Palomino.
- Inglewood: Just east of the Downtown area, Inglewood primarily runs along 9 Ave SE from 8 St SE to 19 St SE. Inglewood is home to many restaurants, antique stores, breweries, and boutiques.
- Kensington: North of the Bow River, the Kensington/Hillhurst area runs North to South from Memorial Dr NW to 8 Ave NW, and East to West from 10 St NW to Crowchild Trail NW. A laid-back neighbourhood full of cafes, shops, pubs, and restaurants, Kensington is easily accessible via the red C-Train line (Sunnyside Station).
- Mission: South of 17th Avenue, Mission is a trendy neighbourhood that runs along 4th Street SW, starting at 17 Ave SW, ending at Elbow Dr SW. Expect to find some of the city's best restaurants, cafes, and shops.
- Victoria Park: East of the Beltline and North of 17th Avenue, Victoria Park runs North to South from 17 Ave SW to 10 Ave SW, and East

to west from 7 St SE to 2 St SW. A go-to spot for delicious meals and inventive cocktails.

■ Other: Other neighbourhoods that are a short drive from central Calgary are Bridgeland (Boogies Burgers, Bike & Brew, UNA Pizza & Wine), Marda Loop (Boogies Burgers), Capitol Hill (Weed's Cafe), and Ramsay (The Compound, Dandy, '88 Brewing), Greenwich (Monki Breakfastclub & Bistro), Bankview (Amanda Prokop RMT).


